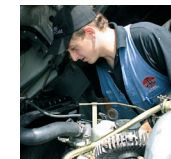
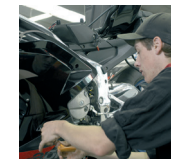

School-based Traineeships

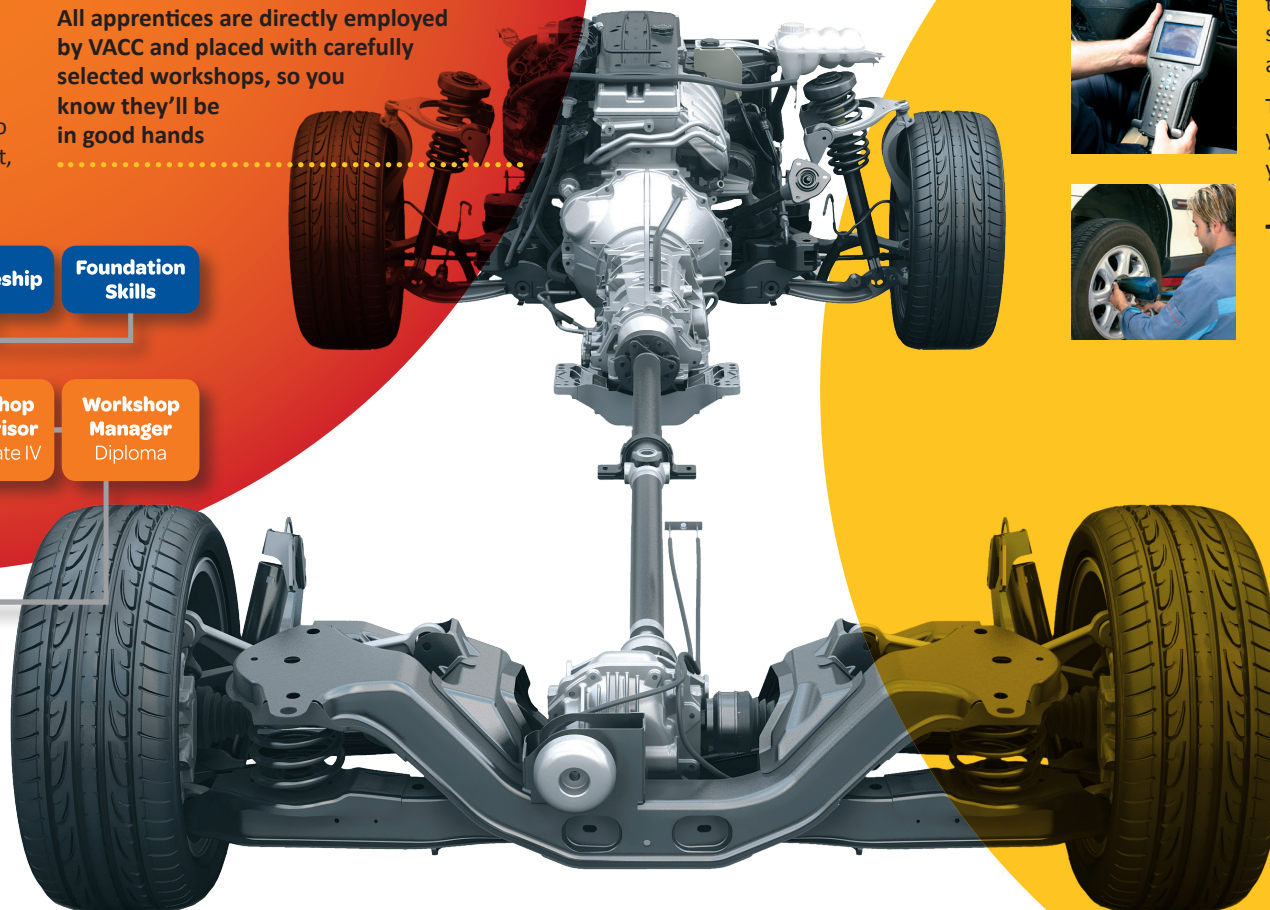
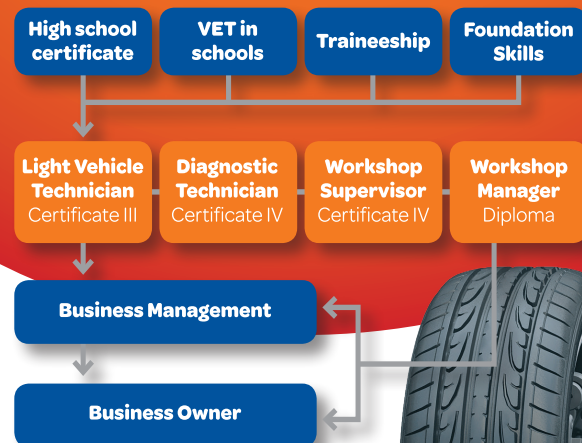
School-based Part-time Traineeships allow VCAL students to train while being paid to work as part of Certificate II Automotive. In most cases, Traineeships provide direct credits for Certificate III (Apprenticeship) studies.

Students undertaking a School-based Traineeship work with workshops for one or two days per week (including school holidays). The rest of the time will be spent at secondary school.

Traineeships generally take two years part-time to complete, during Years 10, 11 or 12. Studies in a School-based Part-time Traineeship contribute to VCAL studies. Students are signed up under a Commonwealth Training Contract.

There are plenty of great reasons why you should promote automotive trades to your students. So get with the program.
